Omar Khan

This web site is built on Producer Omar Khan's research and collection of photography and visual material from the 19th and early 20th century Indian subcontinent. Mr. Khan is Pakistani, with a Dutch mother, and now resides in San Francisco. He works as a multimedia producer and business consultant.

Most recently, Mr. Khan produced an award-winning CD-ROM demo, *Through A Magic Lantern: Jackson's INDIA 1895* (1995). Previous work includes directing a pioneering series of video documentaries on democracy for Pakistan's Parliament on behalf of The Asia Foundation in Islamabad, Pakistan (1990-1992). Earlier he made a acclaimed series of humorous health commercials while working for UNICEF in Pakistan (1983-1985). While receiving an M.B.A. from Stanford Business School in California (1985-1987), Mr. Khan directed an award-winning music video. After business school, he worked for two years as a strategy consultant for the Boston Consulting Group in Los Angeles (1987-1989). He continues consult in the multimedia industry.

Mr. Khan also has an M.A. in the philosophy of art from Columbia University (1983). He recently served on the Board of the Film Arts Foundation (FAF), one of the largest independent regional arts organizations in the U.S.
