Michel Redolfi

Composer

Director of the Centre International de Recherche Musicale (CIRM) in Nice

Born In Marseille in 1951.

In 1968 Michel Redolfi co-founded one of the first French electro-acoustic music studios, the GMEM in Marseille. From 1973 on, he was a US resident and collaborated in studios where the research on digital instruments had taken off (Dartmouth College among others). At this point his pieces involved computer resources, such as "Pacific Tubular Waves" for Synclavier (Fondation Russolo-Pratella Award in 1978).

As of 1981, researcher at the University of California, he launched the concept of *underwater concerts* in California, an event where the music broadcasted in the water is picked up by a floating audience. It's the series called "Sonic Waters", premiered in the Pacific Ocean San Diego then in France at the pool of *Festival de la Rochelle* ; The works that followed develops this concept, particularly "L'écume de la Nuit", commissioned by *Festival Musica* en 1984 for the Roman Baths of Strasbourg. Recently, Redolfi composed an underwater Opera entitled "Crysallis", produced for the Olympic pool in Grenoble (Yumi Nara et Alex Grillo, submerged soloist).

Director of the CIRM (*Centre International de Recherche Musicale*) in Nice since 1986, he continues to explore situations in which musical innovations implies a playful rapport with the listener. Among this line of projects is a collection of *Laser Books* (Albin Michel editions, Paris) and a series of sound designs permanently installed in art and science museums such as *Centre de la Mer Nausicaä*, *Parc de la Villette*, *Fondation Maeght* and the 1992 *World Fair in Seville*.

He also pursues the field of electro-acoustic music, with compositions that are specially conceived for multi-speaker theaters, many of which were commissioned by the GRM (*Groupe de Recherches Musicales*) such as "A Sudden Draft" in 1991. His recent electronic music involves soloists such as Jean-Pierre Drouet, Jean-Paul Celea, Pierre-Yves Artaud, Michael Lonsdale, Steve Shehan. "Portrait of Celea with Double-Bass" won one of the Computer Music Prize at *Ars Electronica* Prize in 1994.

Resident composer at the University of California and at the California Institute of the Arts from 1977 to 1984, he was awarded two grants by the National Endowments for the Arts (NEA). In France he was awarded the SACEM Medal from the French composer's society and became, in 1992, *Officier des Arts et Lettres*, an honorary title given by the French Cultural Minister Jack Lang for excellence in Arts.
